SECOND ANNUAL OKTOBERFEST 5K RUN

This year the brilliant sunshine and the stunning autumn foliage were perfect backdrops for the 3.1 mile run, which started and ended at the historic floating bridge in Pond Village. The race began with Soren Mancauskas sounding the horn to send the runners dashing off.

The field quickly opened up, as the fastest runners dashed up the route's formidable climb. Others stopped to doff their leather lederhosen, which were a chafing obstacle to optimal athletic performance.

There were 36 participants, the same number as last year. Registration, road closings, and encouragement were provided by fourteen volunteers and two officers from the Orange County Sheriff's Department.

Alicia Freese, 34, of Tunbridge won the overall race with a record time of 18:10. Tyler Miles, 38, of Randolph led the male finishers with a time of 19:31.

Thanks to all who helped make the Oktoberfest run such a huge success. It will return in 2023.

SHOW UP FOR BROOKFIELD!

One of the remarkable things about Brookfield is the way the 1,261 citizens, who are spread out over 41.7 square miles and connected by 75.3 miles of mostly dirt roads, come to know one another in different ways. For example, on Sunday, October 16 over thirty people showed up at the Old Town Hall to meet new neighbors and hear about ways to engage in our town, as volunteers or paid town officials.

Families new to Brookfield and those who have lived here for a while heard from town officials and volunteers who staff the Volunteer Fire Department, the Historical Society, the Brookfield Public Library, and the Planning and Conservation Commissions.

Members of the Brookfield Community Partnership spoke about the myriad ways the Old Town Hall in Pond Village connects neighbors and enhances community life with potluck suppers, dances, concerts, debates, a circus for kids, market days and the annual Oktoberfest.

In 2023 Brookfield Town Clerk, Teresa Godfrey, will be leaving Vermont. At the next Town Meeting in March an election will be held to fill her paid positions as Town Clerk, Treasurer and Delinquent Tax Collector. Other positions on the ballot will include Selectboard, Listers, Auditor and Constables. These positions are crucial to our town, and a rewarding way to get to know our unique Vermont place and its residents of all ages.
